During certain times of the year and in certain parts of the state, residential landscape debris burning of dead vegetation, agency sponsored and agricultural burning projects, and broadcast burning is allowed. However, homeowners and land management stewards should always check with their local fire station or CAL FIRE station, as well as local air quality management agency before burning. Burn permits may be required and during the dry months, CAL FIRE will suspend burning altogether.

JUNE GARDENING



- Time to deadhead. Many of us were fortunate to have some of Bob Amnand's iris'.
- Remove suckers from tomato plants.
- Prune shrubs that bloom on old wood after they are done flowering.
- Be on high alert for insect pests and diseases. These include but are not limited to aphids, asparagus beetles, cabbage worms, cutworms, tomato hornworms, scale, snails, slugs, leaf spot, mildew, and rust.
- Use mature compost or aged manure to side-dress plants.
- Prune wisteria after it finishes blooming.
- Place row covers or netting over bushes with ripening berries to keep the birds from eating them.
- Inspect plants for damage from four-lined plant bugs (Poecilocapsus lineatus).
- Inspect trees for nests of bagworms.
- Inspect plants for Japanese beetles (Popillia japonica), including roses, gourds, pumpkins, and squash.
- Stake your tomatoes, mulch them to help keep the soil evenly moist, and fertilize them with a low-nitrogen fertilizer.
- Keep an eye out for diseases (especially fungal diseases) and insect pests on your rose bushes. Keep them fed and keep their soil evenly moist (mulching helps).
- Continue to direct sow the seeds for warm-season vegetables (beans, melons, squash, etc.).
- Ensure that your automatic irrigation system is working properly.
- Fertilize your roses.
- On the south side of our house we have our citrus, time to fertilize.
- Don't forget to empty any containers holding water for those pesky mosquitoes.

ENLOE FLIGHT CARE

Enloe Flight Care

Enloe Flight Care transports patients from many mountain communities, such as Forest Ranch, to Enloe or other medical facilities. They are the only flight care system in California owned and operated by a medical center. Enloe Flight Care has been in operation since July of 1985. They average about 2 flights per day serving a 75 mile radius from Chico. In 2013 a 'state of the art' helicopter, EC130T2 EcoStar was purchased after a successful fundraising program. It is retrofitted with the latest aviation safety technology and medical equipment.

If you were to pay 'out of pocket', the cost of one trip averages \$32,000, plus mileage. If you are a member of the Forest Ranch Community Association, you are eligible for the rate of \$30.00 per year per family. If you are insured by a health plan they usually cover from 40-80% of the charges. As a member, even if you don't have insurance, you will not incur any cost: a savings of between \$6,400.00 and \$32,000. A \$30.00/year cost for being a FRCA member.

Another 'perk' is that you can receive the same service from other areas outside of Butte County. Since Enloe Flight Care is a member of the Association of Air Medical Membership Programs (AAMMP) there are other flight care programs which offer the same services as long as you are signed up. Their partners are located in: Boise, Lewiston & Twin Falls ID, Reno, NV, Billings &, Missoula, MT, Portland OR, and Spokane, WA.

Enloe Flight Care staff also work with local fire departments, including our Volunteer Fire Station 24 and Search & Rescue to fine tune rescue operations. In July, the career firefighters assigned to Station 23 and Forest Ranch Firefighter volunteers participated in "over the edge" training that included coordination with Flight Care. (See page 8)




